# MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD

Wow, 2022 marked a significantly transformative year for BrightStone!

or starters, BrightStone has now fully moved operations onto the Land of Dreams, a 140-acre campus that represents a first of its kind in Tennessee for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Why is this important? Because it opens up the opportunity for BrightStone to welcome many more families through our day program and to address the greatest need for residential teaching homes.

In the process, BrightStone sold its original building for \$3M, which will be reinvested.

Earlier in 2022, Brenda Hauk, Founder and iconic leader of BrightStone, announced her intention to retire after serving its marvelous citizens and their families for 23 years. I'm able to write about BrightStone because of Brenda who started it in a church and over the years established a state of the art program. We are so grateful and humbled by Brenda's massive commitment to a community of people in need.

This spawned the Board to embark on what we called "the single most important decision we would ever be tasked to accomplish". After screening and interviewing over 30 candidates, we put forth the top four candidates in front of the BrightStone leadership team, who overwhelmingly agreed with our decision to promote our own Lee Rose to the CEO post. Lee has been a tremendous leader at BrightStone for the last 15 years and he helped lead the effort to build our Land Of Dreams. Prior to BrightStone, Lee served in the United States Army as an aviator and held various executive leadership roles. Moreover, he shares our passion and will continue the Mission and Vision!



BrightStone has always been very personal for me as I'm the father of an adult with Autism; I fully understand the joys and stresses of families with children who have special needs. Our families should have great reassurance as we have an **amazing Board of Directors** that includes incredibly bright leaders with vast professional experiences offering their expertise and time to BrightStone's leadership team as needed. Our board also includes several BrightStone parents who represent the needs of the individuals and families we serve and those we hope to serve in the future. BrightStone is an **incredible organization** who define caring and commitment, combined with a fully **supportive community**, **together**, we will propel BrightStone to the next level.

As I hope you can see, all of the pieces are in place for making dreams come true! In 2023, we will open the doors for many more adults with special needs, and will welcome a much needed residential teaching community, that will be a source of pride and hope. 

# Health & Wellness: Starting the New Year Strong

ealth and Wellness is a vital part of the BrightStone program, which teaches BrightStone adults skills essential to their personal care—proper hygiene, education about illnesses and how to protect themselves, eating healthy, and proper nutrition. In addition to rotating classes throughout the day, BrightStone adults are encouraged to be active. Whether it is attending a field trip to the bowling alley or the park, or official physical education classes, they are often on the move! Twice a week, exercise class also includes therapeutic yoga, which can help increase strength, flexibility, balance and focus.

One of the greatest resources we have at BrightStone is our full-time RN on staff, Diana Couey. Diana is an essential part of our successful BrightStone program, as she provides both physical and emotional support, careful monitoring of our adults throughout the day, and contributes creative handson education essential to independent personal health and wellness.

At the end of 2022, nurse Diana conducted a survey to collect each BrightStone family's thoughts, questions, confidences, and concerns about BrightStone's Health and Wellness Program. Results will be used to enhance the Health and Wellness program in 2023.
