2023 marked a landmark year for BrightStone! New Campus. New Leader. Great Start To A New Chapter.

or so long it was just a dream. And so, the Land of Dreams became a reality in 2023 as we made official our state of the art "Stinnett Center for Learning, Art, and Enterprise" with a ribbon cutting celebration, and fully moved all of BrightStone's operations onto the Land of Dreams. Why is this a big deal? It's because we can serve more adults with special needs. And the team did just that by wasting no time to begin adding more adults to the program where it's now serving a record 49 adults in the day program!

The capital campaign for Phase I was a little over \$20M. This was a daunting task, yet our development team did it - clearly no challenge is too big! In 2023, with the generous support of community contributions and pledges, we reached the finish line of Phase One of our Capital Campaign! This has been a remarkable journey and feat on the back of an unbelievably generous and supportive community. Thank you from the bottom of my heart, and moreover, our students thank you!

The other reason the Land of Dreams is so important is that it allows us to provide additional services. The greatest worry parents of special needs have is *what happens to my son or daughter when I'm gone*? I can relate to the joys and stresses as a parent of a special needs adult myself. As part of Phase I, we have built two residential homes that will comfortably accommodate 4 adults (each). I'm pleased to say that we have just received the license to open those homes this year! This is a huge need and a massive accomplishment.

And the list of accomplishments doesn't stop there. Also in 2023, BrightStone welcomed the ACT (Autism Career Training) to the Land of Dreams, which is a clinic and day program for adults with autism. They now occupy an available house that came with the property. It's a source of additional income, clinical collaboration, and expansion of the mission and community.

I'm the luckiest Chairman in non-profit because I get to work alongside our new CEO, Lee Rose, our four fabulous Directors, and the marvelous staff at BrightStone who are a masterclass in passion and teamwork. And, of course, we're all here because of the courage and vision of Brenda Hauk who started it all over 24 years ago - that's right, 24 years ago. And so, as we move into 2024, **let us celebrate 25 years!**

Our future is bright with:

- Incredible leadership and staff who demonstrate great perseverance everyday
- Amazing Board of Directors who deeply care some are highly skilled business people, and some are parents of Students at BrightStone
- You alongside our supportive and generous community without whom we could not fulfill this dream

- Embracing Virtual-Reality technology in our Computer Learning Lab to enhance learning and place us on the forefront of modern learning for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
- Continued growth in our programs offering new elective courses such as a leadership development, book club, gardening, photography, show choir, dance, equine therapy and a social & emotional wellness club.
- Expanding our health and wellness programs by taking our students to places like the YMCA to keep them active in the community and physically able to do the things they wish to do.

PROVIDING MORE VARIETY FOR STUDENT INTERESTS

ur program offerings for student participants in our day program continues to grow. This year, we have re-instated a partnership with the Williamson County YMCA that will supplement one of our core tenets of Health and Wellness. Students will rotate in groups once per week to visit the YMCA to engage in sports and recreation such as games in the Youth Activity Center, Basketball, and swimming. BrightStone is also introducing a new Social and Emotional Wellness Club. The club will be an elective offering and will meet once per week to discuss topics such as gratitude, friendship, anger, emotions, etc.

Additional program expansions for this year includes a new Bible Study Group, photography class, and garden club. Renovations of our barn are also planned to include space for animal care, an ADA bathroom, a horticulture classroom and a retail shop.

Congratulations to our amazing BrightStone volunteer, Karen Rogers, who was nominated for the Volunteer Spirit Award at the Franklin Tomorrow Exemplary Community Volunteer Awards. Karen played an instrumental part in the management and distribution of our crops last year, and is now leading the efforts for our new garden club and horticulture program. The new elective program currently has 19 students participating.





An Immersive Learning Experience:

VIRTUAL REALITY COMES TO OUR CLASSROOM! he arrival of advanced technologies based on virtual reality and augmented reality is making its way to our classroom. The new educational-based technology will make realistic and immersive environment learning possible in a way that is physically and psychologically safe, and can be guided by the BrightStone teachers and individuals themselves. It will allow the adults in our day program to explore new interests, and teachers to choose from nearly unlimited topics for lesson plans. BrightStone is thrilled to be able to provide this opportunity for our students to gain additional knowledge about the world. The availability of topics also includes lessons on health and wellness, personal care, and safety—thus, helping students expand their life skills in a unique and engaging way.

The introduction of virtual reality is both an exciting and unique addition to the way adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities learn, and a natural fit for our state-of-the-art learning center, The Stinnett Center for Learning, Art and Enterprise. The integration is made possible through a grant from 100+ Women Who Care Williamson County, a group of women committed to supporting their local community through a giving circle.

The new virtual reality lessons will be in full use on BrightStone's campus this spring, and will begin with a lesson plan on the Solar System. The new technology will allow students to visit various planets for a real-life simulation of life beyond Earth. To complete the lesson, a special celebration is planned for students, staff, and several community members for a real-life solar eclipse viewing on the BrightStone grounds April 8th.
