Launched Our Residential Program!

- We opened 2 new homes, one male and one female serving a total of 8 adults
- Tennessee governor signed into law HB-2497, selecting BrightStone to be the residential pilot program for Middle Tennessee

Significantly Grew Our Day Program!

This means we're serving more adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities in Middle Tennessee where this service is badly needed.

- Last year we grew enrollment and we're not done
- Our vocational program expanded, setting a new standard of excellence

Shattered Our Financial Goals!

- It was a highly successful financial year that enabled us to be debt free and demonstrate resounding sustainability
- Our capital campaign raised over \$2 million, thanks in large part to a \$1 million matching gift from the Stinnett family

We have also added more electives to our day program to address the individual interests of our students, and continually add advanced assistive technologies to our classrooms to ensure all adults can maximize their participation in the program.

Thank you for walking alongside us as we continue this journey. Your belief in our mission empowers us to dream bigger and reach higher. I look forward to connecting with each of you through our annual events, volunteer opportunities, and donor gatherings to celebrate the impact of your generosity.

May God bless you and your family throughout this year. I am excited to see all that we will accomplish together.





BrightStone Chosen by the State of Tennessee for Residential Pilot Program

Because of the growing need for more choice when it comes to long-term housing solutions for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities, the state of Tennessee initiated a new residential pilot program to specifically serve this population. We are beyond proud that BrightStone has been selected to be the ONLY participant in this new pilot residential program that covers 41 counties throughout the state. The BrightStone residential program will be the first of its kind to offer residential housing options for adults with IDD within a campus-like setting.

BrightStone has been approved to build up to 18 residential homes on the Land of Dreams campus. With the support and generosity of our community, we are ready to embrace this incredible honor within the pilot program and move forward with the next stage of our residential Master Plan! The construction of the next two new homes (#3 and #4) is part of the current Homecoming capital campaign for 2025.



The Homecoming Capital Campaign is underway. Since August 2024, \$2.2 million of the \$4 million capital campaign goal has been raised! We are extremely thankful for the support we've received thus far, and for the generosity of our donors and community partners for helping us reach 50% of our goal!

Each of BrightStone's residential homes, including furnishings, costs \$1,000,000 to build. The goal of the Homecoming campaign is to build our next two residential homes, add an operations pavilion, new ourdoor fitness courts, and an ADA fishing pier to provide additional outdoor experiences and improve the health and wellness of our adults. These new programming elements will

also expand the opportunities for more community engagement.

Unlocking Opportunities through BrightStone's Vocational Program







or students with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD), high school represents a structured environment with support systems, individualized education plans (IEPs), and a social framework designed to help them succeed. However, after they graduate, they and their families often face significant challenges as they navigate the transition into adulthood. The future for these individuals depends on their access to employment opportunities, independent living solutions, personal choice, and inclusion within the community. BrightStone's program address all of these needs through individualized program plans (IPP) within the day program and individual support plans (ISP) in the residential homes.

Finding meaningful employment is one of the biggest concerns for adults with IDD who often struggle to learn the skills required for job opportunities or find jobs that align with their abilities and interests. Vocational training has been a core tenet of BrightStone's education program since its inception. The Preparation for Training and HireAbility (PATH) program extends the skills students learn on campus into the community, helping them connect with local employers, gain hands-on experience through internships, explore career interests, and work toward independent employment.

More than half of the adults who attend BrightStone's Day Program participate in the PATH program. Some hold jobs outside of BrightStone's program while others have chosen to volunteer at their work sites following graduation from the PATH program. The students continue to serve in various roles three days per week at Soulshine Pizza and Grace Christian Academy in Franklin, TN, along with The Well food pantry and the Spring Hill Public Library.

Most recently, BrightStone expanded the direction of the PATH program, led by Vocation Coordinator Lindsey Wommer, to include individual job coaching. Hays Howard, a BrightStone Teaching Assistant, is now serving as the Employment Specialist for the program. Expanding the program's staff will allow for greater individualization. The goal is to identify each student's interests, provide targeted training, and proactively seek potential employers that align with those interests. Staff will also work directly with employers to connect students pursuing external employment with available opportunities in the community.

The changes within the PATH program are one more example of how BrightStone is working to create an individualized curriculum for each student where they can reach their full potential and gain purpose through their contributions to the community.

One beautiful Monday in February, I was excited to get together with Julie, a resident of the BrightStone Craig Home, for a "girls lunch." What a fun outing! My goal was to catch up with her to hear more about her life story and how resident living was going, but the fun and laughter was certainly an extra bonus.

n the ride over to the restaurant, Julie and I were talking about her job at Lowe's (Cool Springs), where she has been a cashier for 17 years. She religiously works 40 hours a week, sometimes more in the busy season. "I love my job. I love the people, and it's rewarding helping others" she said. And then, in the short 10 minute ride she wowed me with all of knowledge she has absorbed from working in the gardening department. She educated me on the types of flowers I should plant come spring, how to take care of my irises that I told her had not fared well during the winter, gave me some examples of colorful plants that bloom from bulbs, and told me to be sure to wait until April 15 - tax day - before planting for the warm weather. It's apparent Julie loves what she does, and it's no surprise she has recently won Service Awards from Lowe's for her dedication.

At lunch, I asked Julie how she liked living at BrightStone. She beamed at the question and said it is "great!". "I love being the big sister," she said. "I get to help them learn things they can do on their own, like picking up after taking a shower, or organizing things around the house. They look up to me. I like that."

Julie and I shared BrightStone stories and how we both fell in love at first sight. For her, it was coming to see the residential homes after her dad's friend had told him about BrightStone. "I loved the house. I knew right away I wanted to live there," she said. Having her wish answered, she moved into The Craig Home earlier last year.

Julie said she likes to spend her free time at her new home doing puzzles, spending time with her housemates and home manager, Hannah. On her own, she enjoys coloring,

and cooking. Once a week she has a Zoom call with her best friend, Pam, and they cook together while sharing some laughs. They've been best friends since attending Westminster Elementary School together.

Julie also likes to travel with her big sister, Lisa, whom she shares some of her fondest memories with. She started laughing as soon as I asked her about Lisa. "We have fun. I love to play jokes on her," she giggled. She shared a story about how she once gave her a gift that was a tiny little present wrapped up in a bunch of bigger boxes. "She always knows it's me because she always knows I like to play jokes on her." As Julie and I swapped family stories, she also recalled when her sister called to tell her she was going to be an aunt for the first time and how happy it made her to hear the news.

Julie graduated from Hillsboro High School and has been a hard worker throughout her adult life. Prior to Lowe's, she worked as a cashier at CompUSA for over a decade before they went out of business. Anxious to find a new role and knowing how much she loved working with people, Julie attended a job fair and was quickly hired by Lowe's to start the position she still holds today.

When I asked Julie what she is most proud of, she said "I am most proud that I am still able to do things to help others. I love being able to get out on my own. I love my independence and my freedom." Julie has clearly been a great contributor to BrightStone and the community.


I can't wait until our next time out to share more good times, laugh, and learn some more from Julie.
