

AT BRIGHTSTONE

NEW RECREATIONAL AREA

Check out our beautiful new recreational area with great Pickleball Courts and new basketball goals! Thank you to the following construction partners for bringing it all to life: Barton Sports Construction, Volunteer Fence, Billy Mix, and Tennessee Valley Paving.

The new area is being used for a variety of student activities, including the on-campus Train 4 Life fitness program sponsored by the Special Olympics of Middle TN. BrightStone recently launched its first 12-week Special Olympics Train 4 Life Program. The program focuses on functional fitness, strength, endurance, mobility, balance nutrition, and positive lifestyle habits. The program includes one in-person workout at BrightStone a week, 2 home workouts each a week, along with nutritional and mental health education weekly. The program also includes pre and post program health and fitness testing.

We currently have 9 students participating in Train 4 Life at BrightStone. In August, we will add a second session of 6-8





UNIVERSITY PARTNERSHIPS PROVIDE A BLESSING

We are extremely grateful for an amazing partnership with Belmont University's Occupational Therapy program. The partnership will bring three 2nd-year program students to our campus every day August 25 through November 14. These Level 2 occupational therapy students will be under the direction of Dr. Caroline Hillyard, one of our distinguished BrightStone Board Members. The Belmont students will work with our students on both fine motor skills and sensory adaptation. The program includes evaluations and individualized plans enabling measurable results.

This will be an ongoing partnership with Belmont beyond the November date. Two additional Belmont students meeting their final Doctorial requirements will come in the Spring, and will be observed by other first year students completing their required 40 hours/semester of Occupational Therapy observation.

We are extremely excited to be blessed by partnerships with universities to benefit from the talents of their students. Lipscomb University's Department of Education will also be partnering with BrightStone this Fall. Several first year Education major students will come on site as part of their first-year Special Education requirement of 10 hours of observation per semester.

We are so blessed to have these university students share their talents with us!

All students from universities are fully vetted before serving on campus, must complete an orientation, and properly identify with their student I.D. whenever they are on campus.

Immediate Needs

OPERATIONS PAVILION

Our campus is buzzing with activity as we prepare for more growth. Right now, our most immediate need is a new Operations Pavilion. This 3,200sf approved facility, costing \$800,000, is essential for our transportation needs. We need to store and maintain donated three-wheel bikes, golf carts, our three passenger vans, and two large buses! As we continue to grow—adding more homes, facilities, staff, and adults—our need to expand and maintain our transportation fleet will grow right along with us.

The Operations Pavilion will serve our recreation, fitness, community activities, and vocational PATH program, which transports our adults to employer worksites. This Pavilion will serve all of our adults and staff daily by fueling every aspect of our educational programs and mission. Thank you for helping us fund this vital facility!



FUNDING MORE HOMES

Our \$4,000,000 Homecoming Capital Campaign, launched in November 2024, has already raised an incredible \$2,200,000! Construction is underway to add infrastructure (water, sewer, electricity) in the ground for more six more homes, with completion targeted by the end of 2025.

Our plan includes building two new homes in 2026, but we need an additional \$1,000,000 in cash or pledges (in 2025), which will allow us to build two homes vs just one home. Families are patiently waiting for our new homes, and your support is all we need to allow us to move forward.




